Sightseeing tour of Zagreb with local h/d guide

Zagreb is Croatia's capital, as well as being a business centre, university centre, city of culture, art and entertainment. Springing up from two medieval settlements - Kaptol and Gradec, which form the core of the old Upper Town, it is a true Central European city and with the surrounding settlements it has about one million inhabitants. On your sightseeing tour of Zagreb you will see famous street of Cyril and Method, St. Mark's Square with its impressive roof displaying the Croatian coats of arms, City Hall, Parliament and Stone Gate. You will also see St. Stephen's Cathedral where lies the tomb of cardinal Stepinac who was martyred for saving the Jews during World War II., Ban Jelacic Square with the statue of Viceroy Josip Jelacic on the horse and many other monuments.

Day 02 – Zagreb – Plitvice lakes - Split

Sightseeing of NP Plitvice with a local guide.

Walking tour through the park of 16 bigger and smaller lakes connected with 92 cascades and waterfalls, unique phenomenon more than 4000 years old, that was put on the list of UNESCO's list of World Natural Heritage. Plitvice Lakes represent one of the largest national parks in Croatia, and according to many characteristics and scientific value, they are one of the most notable reserves in all of Europe. In 1979, it was added to the **UNESCO** List of World Heritage.

Please note: The sightseeing included walking tour in the nature so we suggest to bring comfortable clothes and shoes, sunglasses and similar.

Sightseeing of Split with a local guide - **UNESCO site**

The h/d city tour in Split starts with sightseeing of the Palace of the Emperor Diocletian which is the heart and of Split, built in 295.y. BC, but still a living monument. In that magnificent palace you will see 4 gates, the most famous is Golden gate and in front of it you will see the statue of Grgur Ninski made by Ivan Meštrović, square Peristil where the emperor's speeches took place,... After visiting the palace, immediately outside you will see many charming "piazzas". At the end of the city tour we will take you to the Riva, a coastal walk with palm trees where you can relax in the sun and enjoy a beautiful view of the port and close-by islands.

Hvar belongs to the central island group of the Adriatic and lies in an east-west direction at right angles to the coast. These islands together are called „The Hvar Group“. The eastern promontory of Hvar is only 4,5 km away from the mainland, while the western one faces the open sea. „Lower Hvar“, the western part, is called the „head of the island“, as its main area. Plume – the eastern part – gets narrower towards „the top“. Hvar (68 km long), is also the fourth largest in area.

Meeting with local guide for h/d sightseeing tour of Dubrovnik, **UNESCO site**

Dubrovnik is rich in cultural and historical monuments and is included in UNESCO World Heritage List. Dubrovnik Summer Festival is held annually here, and the city is also the venue for scientific, scholarly and literary conferences and world tourist congresses. The most recognizable feature which defines the History of Dubrovnik and gives it its characteristic are its intact city walls which run uninterrupted for 1940 meters encircling the city. This complex structure, one of the most beautiful and strongest fort systems in the Europe is the main attraction to the city's visitors. Here you will visit the Cathedral and the Franciscan Monastery and see the Onophrio's fontaine.

You will ride on the **cable car** to mountain Srđ and enjoy the spectacular panoramic view on Dubrovnik. We suggest you to take a refreshment in the bar up the hill.
